# **DBP Spotlight!**

### Did you know that we have a Feeding Clinic here at BMC?

**Feeding Clinic** is for any child being seen at BMC who is experiencing feeding-related difficulties. This can include sensory issues around feeding, Avoidant/Restrictive Food Intake Disorder (ARFID), difficulties with chewing and swallowing, and challenges with trying new food.
