General Assistance

Autism Care Today

- Offers grants up to \$5000 to families, with priority given to those with a household income under \$100,000. Funding may be used for ABA, speech, OT, medications, home safety devices, social skills groups, and more.

General Assistance

Social Security Child Disability Report

- Children from birth up to age 18 may get Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits. They must be disabled and they must have little or no income and resources.

Transportation Access Pass (TAP) CharlieCard

- People with disabilities and Medicare cardholders are eligible for reduced MBTA fares with a Transportation Access Pass (TAP) CharlieCard. TAP CharlieCards can be loaded with:
 - Cash value for roughly 50% reduced one-way fares
 - \$10 7-Day LinkPasses
 - \$30 monthly LinkPasses
 - Reduced monthly passes for Commuter Rail, Ferry, and Express Bus


- Special Needs Grants provide financial assistance to active duty CGMA clients who have dependents with special needs.
