About Us

Living Well at Home (LWAH) is Boston Medical Center's housing services department. Since 1986, LWAH has worked with BMC patients to break cycles of homelessness and housing instability. Through *individualized*, *long-term housing case management* our LWAH Housing and Community Support Specialists work with patients to find, maintain, and thrive in independent housing. We also provide behavioral health consultation services and work closely with other clinical departments to provide wraparound care to clients.
